

Dog friendly things to do during your stay

Starting from Hartsop Fold

- Morning/evening walks to the waterfall to stretch the legs (go out of the bottom of the park and pick up the track heading towards the fell).
- Hikes: you can do 42 Wainwright fells from the door of your lodge. Some of the most popular are Angle Tarn & Angletarn Pikes, Brock Crags, Place Fell, and High Hartsop Dodd. There are also some easier hikes such as Brothers Water and the footpath to Patterdale and Glenridding.
- Walk to the Brothers Water Inn see our pinned video on social media for a scenic route avoiding the road (booking recommended).

The local area

- Walk to Patterdale and Glenridding to visit the villages and pubs (White Lion in Patterdale is a staff favourite).
- Glenridding has a number of places to eat and some shops.
- Hikes: Helvellyn (challenging fell park in Glenridding and check weather conditions). Aira Force waterfall you can add on Gowbarrow fell for a longer distance and 'bag' a Wainwright (10-15 min drive), Fairfield Horseshoe (hard), Hallin fell (accessible using the Ullswater Streamers from Glenridding and walking back to the lodge), Ullswater Way (moderate walking but long distance Ullswater Steamers can be utilised).
- Ullswater Steamers for a scenic cruise or to access other parts of Ullswater for a walk (such a Hallin fell).
- Pooley Bridge for lunch (Granny Dowbekins or Secret Garden). Great atmosphere.

Day trip to Ambleside and/or Windermere

- Wander around the town lots of cafes and shops
- Scenic cruise on Windermere (England's largest lake) combine with a trip to a local attraction.
- Hikes near Windermere/Ambleside: Orrest Head (easy), Wansfell Pike (moderate), Tarn Hows Circular Walk (easy), Windermere Western Shore and Wray Castle (easy)
- Wild Boar for lunch/alternative afternoon tea (staff favourite).



Day trip to Keswick

- Keswick (dog friendly capital of Britain) is about a 40 min drive away. The market is on Thursdays and Saturdays - enjoy a wander around the stalls and brunch/lunch - Lake Road Brunch is great but there are many good places to eat.
- Hikes near Keswick Walla Crag (medium difficulty), Catbells (medium) or Latrigg (easy), Keswick-Threlkeld railway walk (easy), walk around Derwent Water (medium).
- Cruise around Derwent Water with Keswick Launch Co.
- Dinner at the Horse & Farrier pub in Dacre on the way back from Keswick.

Day trip to Penrith area

- Lowther Castle & Gardens great for walks and a good café
- Abbott Lodge Jersey Ice Cream small play area for children and delicious ice cream.
- Hikes: Great Mell Fell (moderate), Askham/Helton common (easy), Arthur's Pike (moderate) Blencathra (challenging), Carrock Fell & High Pike (moderate)
